Nature of support
<p>The government offers funding to tackle inequalities between children on free school meals and their peers called the pupil premium. Pupil Premium funding supports pupils who are currently eligible for free school meals, or who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years.</p> <p>For the academic year 2017/2018 our pupil premium funding was £73,374 which we allocated to the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Retention of support staff • Small group Music tuition with peripatetic teacher subsidised. • Educational visits including residential visits subsidised • Nurture groups • Staff CPD – Nurture/ Team Teach • Access to OOH provision. • Attendance monitoring • Resources

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Behaviour support • Nurture group 	<p>Vulnerable PP pupils accessed professionals to support emotional and mental health.</p> <p>Staff have received training to support Nurture groups.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subsidised trips and transport costs for PP pupils. 	<p>Disadvantaged pupils across school have accessed visits throughout the year including a residential visit for Y5 and Y6 PP pupils. This has enriched their life experiences and provided opportunities that they may not access outside of school.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wider opportunities subsidy for music tuition 	<p>Peripatetic music teachers have worked in large group and small group sessions with KS1 and KS2 pupils. Children enjoy their lessons and are developing a range of skills.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendance monitoring 	<p>Persistent absence of PP children is quickly identified and the number of PA, pupil premium children decreased from 11 pupils (autumn term) to 3 pupils (summer term).</p> <p>Parents/Carers continue to be accountable to explain all absence from school.</p> <p>Unauthorised holidays challenged resulting in some pupils now taking holidays during school holidays rather than in school time.</p>
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Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The impact of that expenditure on pupil premium children was as follows:

- All children received specific individual support with core subject intervention sessions. This targeted provision was successful for most pupils in enabling them to catch up with other pupils if they had fallen behind and for others, to accelerate their progress further.
- 83% of Year 6 PP pupils attended the outdoor and adventurous residential to improve independence; develop team building and provided access to challenging outdoor activities.
- 100% of Y5 PP pupils attended a residential visit to broaden their cultural experiences.
